Update on Projects:

There are many tasks currently in progress within the City in addition to the daily/regular tasks of customer service and other duties.

Regularly included with this update is a separate document from the City Engineer regarding projects they are working on and the status. Additional updates will be provided below as needed.

Administration

Events: 2nd Annual Special Olympics Polar Plunge – March 23, 2024

<u>Code Enforcement</u>: Waiting for street signs to address issues around town.

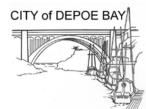
Grants: Nothing current.

<u>Technology, Audio & Security Upgrade Project</u>: Equipment received. Implementation in January.

<u>Utility Lines Issue Update</u>: City staff, the Zitniks, and a representative from Spectrum met to discuss the cabling concern of the Zitniks. Spectrum provided a ballpark figure of about \$5,000 to run their lines underground in front of Zitniks' residence and their nearby neighbors. Spectrum shared that the options are for the City to pay for the costs; otherwise this would need to be paid for by the property owners. The Spectrum representative visited the area with the Zitniks. Staff did not attend. On December 21, staff received an email from the Zitniks that they do not intend to pursue the communication cable issue with Council.

The Hills & Whale Watch Developments: Staff have been working with project representatives to address some issues with the infrastructure as noted by the City Engineer. There continues to be concerns with the water system pressure and planned reservoir, the stormwater detention/retention ponds, and questions about the sewer system. The City, our City Engineer and their project leaders met on December 26 to discuss resolution. Project representatives will work on addressing the concerns of our City Engineer and provide that to him. They were very willing and receptive to address the issues.

<u>"Rebranding"</u>: In the AP, Dream Coast Media did some work on the design of the pole banners and noted it as rebranding. On the January 16 meeting, I'm presenting an idea for a potential new logo for the City to provide a consistent and updated (to some extent) image for our City. This is simply an idea that has worked for other cities in presenting a polished and professional look while



showing off our treasures. The rebranding simply refers to how we present ourselves. I've begun working on that over the past year with requiring the font for letters, forms, reports and other things the City puts out for Century Gothic 11pt and New Times Romance for Resolutions and Ordinances. It's simply to make sure the City is putting our best foot forward. I'll explain more at the meeting and show some samples for consideration.

Financial

<u>Audit</u>: The City Attorney is drafting a termination of services letter to be sent to Isler the first week of January. The RFP will post in the paper on Wednesday, January 10 and run for a month. In preparation for a new auditor, staff are "fixing" the paperwork for 19/20 that was put in disarray by current auditors and are also working on getting 20/21 ready.

<u>Budget</u>: Now that the new year is on us, budget season will begin soon. Attached is a draft budget calendar.

Harbor

<u>Harbor Restoration Project</u>: Project was rebid in December with a closing date of January 9. Staff is requesting a special Council meeting on January 10 at 5:00 PM to award the contract to help keep the project on track.

Staff submitted a request for an extension on the project for one of the grant funding streams. Everything has been provided to the grant analyst. City is awaiting for decision on the extension.

<u>Dock Leases</u>: Staff have researched other sites and harbors and have material to present at a scheduled work session in January.

<u>General</u>: Crew have worked on fabricating and installing heavier duty hinges on dock 1. The image shows a failing one. They are replacing about 4. Recently, the crew pressured washed the concrete

fuel bunker. Replacing the worn and faded fuel protocol placards for hose reel and building. During storm events, as needed have worked with captains and boat owners to address filling up of water and securing lines.

<u>Water</u>

<u>Collins Water Line Replacement</u>: City Engineer continues working with public works on concept plans and drawings fore bidders. The City Engineer provided a material list for the crew to begin purchasing needed materials such as pipe and hydrants.

<u>Foundation/Filter Replacement</u>: Delta visited the plant on 12/18 to take boring samples around foundation to begin process of designing for the replacement.

<u>Potable / Culinary Wells Project</u>: The last step is testing the water, which has to be done on a Wednesday. Oregon Health Authority said we have until spring 2024 to test.

<u>General</u>: The 1.2-million-gallon tank was cleaned and inspected. Only a few minor issues, which can be fixed in-house. The company is working on a quote to painting the outside. Replaced the 2" water line at the back side of Indian Trail and at Highway 101.

<u>Wastewater</u>

Catwalk Repairs: Reviewing recommended bid package from City Engineer.

<u>General</u>: NPDES permit is in a 30-day public hearing stage. After the Public Works Director met with DEQ, DEQ determined that the plant is a wastewater level II plant, so we only need a wastewater operator II for the next five years when the permit is renewed. A contractor has been scheduled for sewer main cleaning throughout the City (per the 23/24 Inl budget).

Streets

<u>Vista (Lingcod) Parking Lot</u>: City Engineer visited the site on November 21 and met with concerned residents. On December 17, the concerned residents were provided an erosion control plan, which has satisfied the residents. With the holidays over, the crew plan to begin installation of the fence and construct for erosion control as recommended by our City Engineer.

Heighberg – The street runoff from the stormwater is going through like funnel into a neighboring property. Crew will work with the City Engineer to design a berm.

<u>General</u>: Spectrum scheduled to begin cold patch work on repairing areas and sidewalks. As soon as companies begin making asphalt, they will then put in the final fixes and overlays.

Parks

<u>Big Tire Park</u>: Bench and concrete have been removed. A recommendation was provided to the Council under an agenda item.

<u>Community Hall Cabinet Replacement</u>: Delay on new cabinets order and installation until after the holidays.

North Bridge Replacement: City Engineer continues to work on bid documents & project plans for replacement.

Winchell Lookout: Contractor is still scheduled for after the first of the year.

<u>Recreational Immunity</u>: Parks Commission will begin their review of the parks after the first of the year. As an update, in addition to the closing of a trail by Waldport, since the last Council meeting, Tillamook County closed Tire and Short Beach trails in Oceanside and the Port of Garibaldi closed their Harborview Trail as well as are delaying trail projects. City leaders reported the reason for these closings is that many of those were in rough condition. It is anticipated that this recreational

immunity issue will be addressed in the legislature in February. Other cities are debating closing trails in January.

<u>General</u>: Nature trail storm debris clean-up is ongoing. Will be looking at scheduling the County work crew to lay gravel. Crew had to replace four doors at the restroom and fish cleaning station due to vandalism due to people kicking doors in and out. There has also been vandalism at the Woodmark restrooms so those partitions will need to be replaced. The owner has been contacted regarding work done on their walls and repairing the hot water heater which also needs to be replaced.

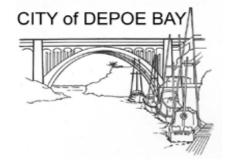
